Struggle for Civil Rights



Civil Rights Act of 1964



- Outlawed discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, or national origin
- Ended segregation in public places
- Desegregated public schools



Women's Rights Movement 1960's



Women's Rights Laws



1963 Amendment to Fair Labor Standards Act

-- Prohibits discrimination in the workplace based on sex

1972 Title IX of the Education Act

-- Prohibits discrimination based on sex in federally-funded **education** programs or activities



Rights for People with Disabilities



Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act

- first civil rights law in the United States for people with disabilities.
- prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in programs that receive federal financing



Rights for People with Disabilities

- 1975 Education for All Handicapped Children Act
 - Provided equal access to public education and one free meal to children with physical and emotional disabilities
- 1990 Individuals with Disabilities Act
 - Students with Disabilities are entitled to receive special, individualized educational services

Rights for People with Disabilities



1990 Americans with Disabilities Act

- prohibits discrimination based on disability
- requires all public buildings, schools, railways, public transportation, and commercial facilities be accessible to people with disabilities

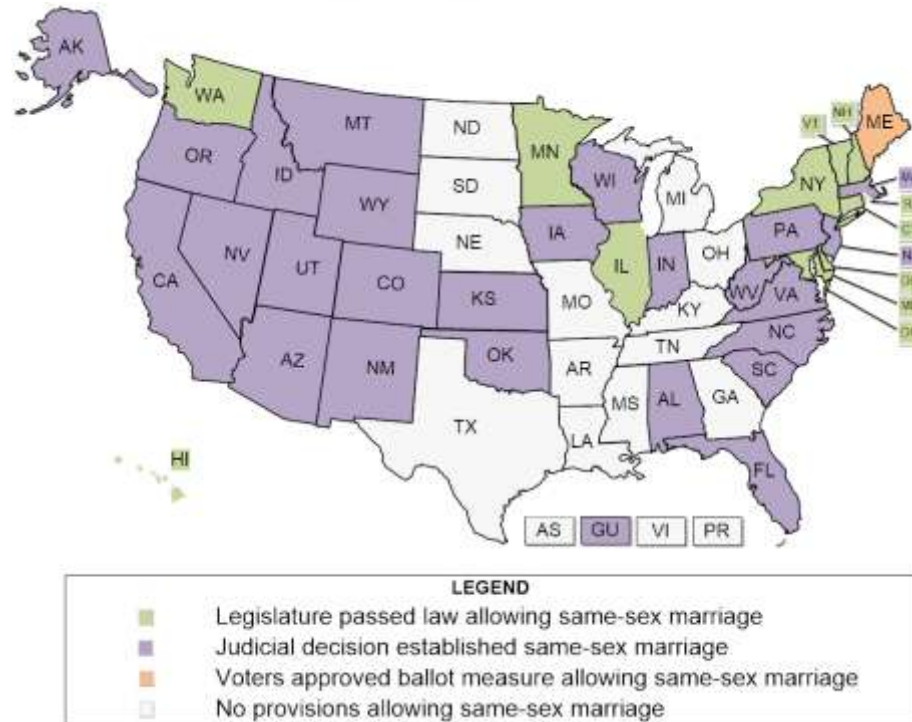
1993 Don't Ask Don't Tell (DADT)

- President Bill Clinton passed this policy allowing gays to serve in the military as long as they kept their sexuality a secret.

1996 Defense of Marriage Act

- U.S. Congress passed this law denying same-sex couples from receiving marriage benefits from the federal government.
